



Approval of Minutes

The minutes of the previous meeting weren't available for approval.

Officer Reports

Chair

Given by MB in the absence of LC.

Thanks were given to those who drove to the Bonfire Night on Monday. The meeting was thought to have gone well, but disappointment was expressed at the low number of Freshers who attended.

The rest of the meetings so far this term have been well attended, with at least 15 people at each meeting.

Chair Elect

Nothing has been decided for definite yet, but there are a number of possible ideas including: Skittles, Ultimate Frisbee, Pancakes, Tissue Paper Hot Air Balloons, and the Cotsworld Marathon.

The colour of the pipeline is blue.

Treasurer

We are trialling not using the Events Account this year as it is currently a mess. Everything is now going through the Current Account instead.

The £10 that was transferred from the Current Account on the 2nd June is still a mystery. The bank have been queried twice about it, but still haven't got back to us with any information.

The use of expenses sheets have been reinstated, and all members requiring reimbursement for expenses should fill one in. Copies are available on the website.

The current signatories on the account are Luke Cartey, Michelle Barton, James Baker and Lizzy Horne. We are trying to avoid both Luke and Michelle signing the same cheques.

It is unknown where the insurance renewal forms are going to be sent, or when it will need to be renewed. MB is going to investigate this.

The account balances stand as follow:

Current Account - £871.18

Events Account - £397.51

Old Members Account - £319.49

MB is going to query whether we should be getting interest on the Old Members account.

MB will also try to find out what happened to the Savings Account. As far as we are aware, it was last accessed by RO in 2002, but there are no records of it in the Treasurers file.

Secretary

The re-registration forms have been sent to the Proctors, but haven't yet been returned.

SSAGO Rep

Not present.

Internet Officer

The internet is still there.

SAGLO

No longer wants to be SAGLO because RO has managed to upset Val Butcher (DC Scouts) and is about to upset the Guides.

Membership Secretary

We currently have 8 current members, 5 new members and 12 old members (not all of whom have paid).

Annual Dinner

The 91st Annual Dinner will be held on Friday 30th April (Friday 1st Week, TT10) at Christ Church.

The estimated cost of a non-drinking ticket is around £32. There is some confusion about Corkage fees, so the estimated price of a drinking ticket is unknown.

MB is going to send out an e-mail to all members notifying them of the date.

It was pointed out that the dinner is being held the night before May Morning, and that we should incorporate May Morning into our plans - possibly by having a Punt and Breakfast rather than the traditional Punt and Picnic.

Winter Walking

We have booked a building at Consall Scout Camp in the South Peak District for 27th December 2009 to the 3rd January 2010. The price isn't fixed yet, but will be cheaper than last year and probably in the region of £10 per person per night.

Any Other Business

An e-mail will be going out about a stash order within the next week. The order will be with Shirtworks as normal because we already have the design set up there and will not have to pay a set up cost.

There will also possibly be the option of novelty stash based on the I♥NY designs. The cost of this will be around £5 a t-shirt if there is enough interest.
