If you want the chance to see your idea turned into a beer, then make sure you're at Winter Walking, as there probably won't be any left afterwards!

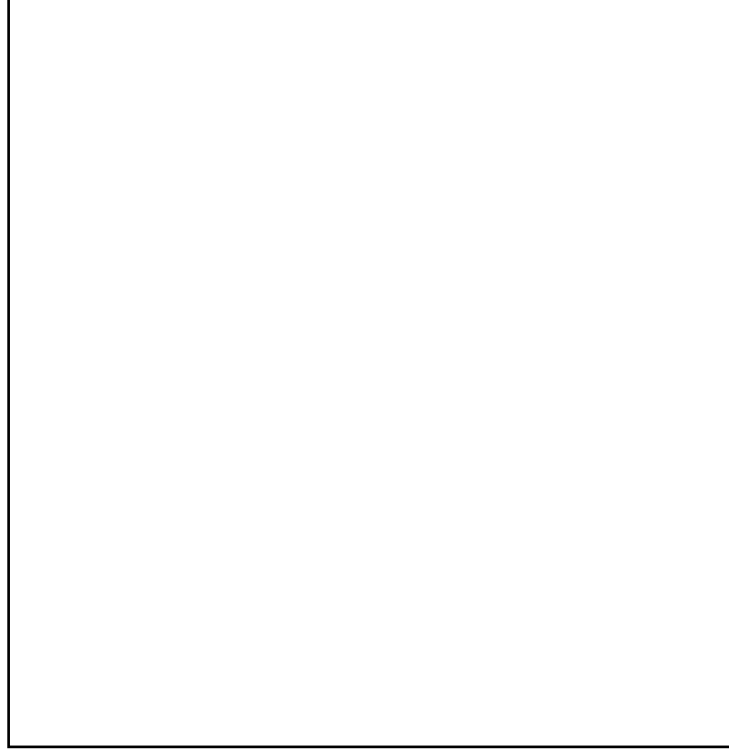

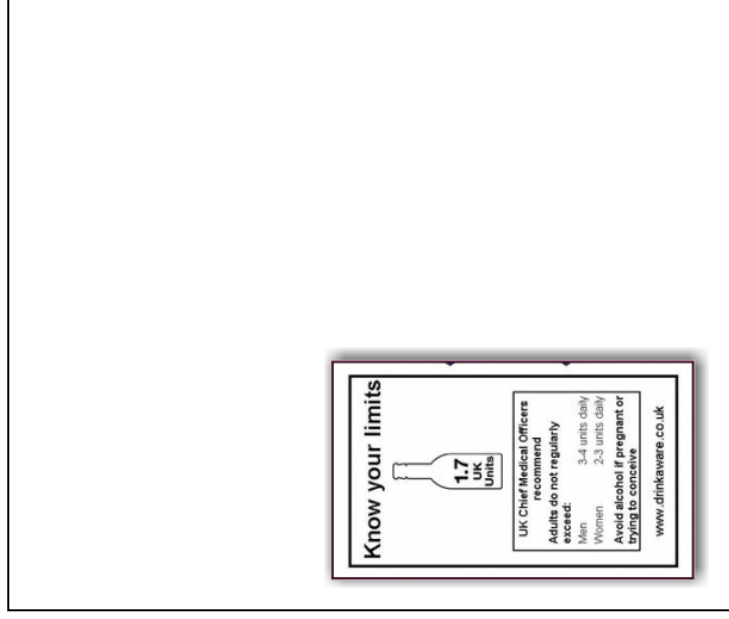

Winter Walking promises to be a fantastic event this year, with a bumper turnout! There's still time to book your place, so please send an e-mail to winterwalking@ousgg.org.uk with the following information:

- Name (help is allowed with spelling)
- Date of arrival (to the nearest century; if arriving by train under no circumstances tell anyone the predicted arrival time)
- Date of departure (preferably decided only 10 minutes before leaving)
- Mode of transport (Train, car, plane, riding an animal, transporter (a la Star Trek). Extra points will be awarded if you arrive by Lion or shipping container).
- Any dietary requirements (but only after the organiser has gone shopping. Bonus points for disliking a common food item e.g mushrooms, cheese, chocolate)
